
What is an EXHIBITION?



• Exhibition is a culminating project for 5th graders

• The theme of this project is "Sharing the Planet", and you will work to research an issue/topic that you want to help stand up and take action

against.





What will you do?

- This week you will work on researching topics/issues that are of interest to you.
- It is very important that your topic of choice should be, not only one that you feel invested in, but also that is substantial enough for research and ACTION.



Some topics/issues that former students have chosen to spread awareness about:

Few Examples:

- Puppy mills
- SPCA
- PTSD
- Cyber bullying
- Bees and pollination
- Deforestation
- Anxiety
- Water scarcity
- Pollution
- Orphanages
- Endangered species (pick one)

- These notes can be organized in a way that works best for you ©




Topic Assignment: Choose your top 3 topics and answer the following questions for **EACH** topic and post on Dojo. (use c.u.p.s and complete sentences)

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Creating Lines of Inquiry



Breaks down the big picture

Examples:



(My approved topic is: water scarcity)

Lines of Inquiry:

- Reasons to save water
- How to find clean water
- Ways to spread awareness (this one can be used for all projects)

*Using the same starter words in the example above is suggested. It will help you stay on track. Start your lines of inquiry with the 3 starter words reasons, how, and ways. All students may use the "ways to spread awareness" as one of their 3 lines of inquiry. *

Researching your topic: Your research will be guided by answering key concept questions that you will develop. You will thoroughly answer each question you develop through your research.

A significant part of the **EXHIBITION** is to include all of the **KEY CONCEPTS**. Understanding the key concepts will create a deep understanding of your topic.

- See the key concept questions examples on the next 2 slides for the example topic "Global Warming".
- More details about the key concept research will follow after the next 2 example slides. Please read through the chart carefully to grasp a better understanding.



Key Concept	Question	Inquiry Into:	Example for Global Warming
Form	What is it like?	Properties, structure, similarities, differences, patterns	What is global warming?
Function	How does it work?	Behavior, communicatio n, pattern, role, systems	What will global warming do to our planet?
Causation	Why is it like this?	Consequences, sequences, pattern, impact	Who and/or what is causing global warming?
Cnange	How is it changing?	Adaptation, growth, cycles, sequences, transformations	How have efforts to slow down global warming evolved over time?

Connection	How is it connected to other things?	Systems, relationships, networks, homeostasis, interdependence	How are greenhouse gas emissions connected to global warming?
Perspective	What are the points of view?	Subjectivity, truth, beliefs, opinion, prejudice	What is the global controversy? What are the points of view from different nations?
Responsibility	What is our responsibility?	Rights, citizenship, values, justice initiative	What is our responsibility as citizens of the world?
Reflection	How do we know?	Review, interpretation, evidence, responsibility, behavior	How do we know that our efforts have been effective?
